 - You won't need a lot of money while at camp because everything you do is included in the price. You will need spending money for dinner on the way home. There is a camp store that sells Young Life/Malibu apparel and other stuff. There is also a snack bar that sells milkshakes, candy, nachos and such for your sugar fix. US money is accepted.

What kind of activities are offered at camp?

Ropes Course

Set at the foot of Mt. Albert, our high ropes course weaves through the trees of an old growth forest. The course provides an opportunity for individuals to challenge themselves and develop self-confidence through success. The ropes course and its operators are certified each year by Adventure Experiences, Inc.

Zip Line

Experience the thrill of freefalling from a treetop platform. The Malibu zip line starts high on a treetop platform where a certified operator will harness you in for the exhilarating ride to the inlet. Minimum 100 pounds.

Water Sports

Are you looking to get some sick air and pull a fat tantrum? Perhaps you prefer to carve through glassy water on an early morning ski. Or maybe you just want to battle three of your friends on a pair of tubes. Whatever water sport you choose, Malibu has the equipment to make your wish come true. If you'd rather stay dry, take a turn as a spotter in one of the brand new tournament boats.

Climbing Wall

The climbing wall has five climbing stations that can be used simultaneously. Each station has several routes available that provide challenges appropriate for all skill levels.

Gym & Weight Room

The gym, with radiant floor heating, provides an ideal venue for large group activities, basketball and volleyball tournaments, or floor hockey. Located in the mezzanine, the weight room has free weights, benches, and cardio equipment for the fitness-minded guests.

PLUS Kayaking, Sailing, Sand Volleyball, and a Swimming Pool.

I see that camp overlaps with the last day of school?

Mars Hill Church has been given a week time slot at a very sought after camp (Malibu Club). We will be bringing students from many different school districts across Washington and Portland that all have different end days of their school year. With far enough planning, and not missing many other days during the semester, most schools should be able to accommodate your request to miss the last day (or two). Most schools do not plan any academic work on the last few days, but if so, advance approval to take tests or turn in projects early might be necessary. The camp was also scheduled before the snow storm hit most of the state.

Why is the cost of Malibu so low for Mars Hill Church?

When young life groups go to Malibu they go for 6 nights instead of 5. They also wrap the cost of staff into the student's price per person, which ends up being around \$700-750 per camper (and still they end up with a waiting list). Mars Hill Church will raise additional funds to help cover staff expenses so that student prices do not have to rise higher.

Why is the camp cost so high?

Camp, like everything, is expensive. Here is a list of other local camps and what they are charging for their camp experience.

- Northwest Soccer Camp (Kenmore) \$595-\$799
- Sambica (Bellevue) \$449-\$594
- Island Lake (Poulsbo) \$398 – additional \$45-104 for activities
- Miracle Ranch (Port Orchard) \$349-\$649 – additional \$45-104 for activities
- Warm Beach (Stanwood) \$396
- Camp Berachah (Auburn) \$304-\$368
- Camp Gilead (Carnation) \$300

Why do campers have to leave for camp so early in the morning?

The travel from the Seattle area to Malibu, Canada involves many steps (listed below). The coaches that we will be traveling in are comfortable for the long travel along with providing restrooms that allow for continuous travel.

1. Driving from downtown Seattle to the Canadian Border (2 hours)
2. Crossing the Border (1/2 hour to 2 hours)
3. Driving from the Border to the Horseshoe Bay/Langdale (aka Sunshine Coast) Ferry (1.5 hours)
4. Taking the Ferry (45 minutes)
5. Driving from Langdale to Egmont where the Malibu Princess is docked. (1.5 hours)
6. Taking the Malibu Princess to the Malibu Club (3 hours)

How can I ensure the safety of my camper?

Malibu Camp has been in operation since 1954 and does everything in its power to make sure every camper is safe. There are 2 Doctors that stay the entire week at Malibu with the campers. They are on call throughout the week for emergencies or at the "Medicine man" ½ hour after breakfast and dinner. They are also at every event throughout the week should they be needed.

Will valuables be safe?

Malibu Club assumes no responsibility for any lost or stolen items. Although it is recommended that valuables not be brought to camp, they will be able to be stored in secure lockers in each cabin. You must bring a lock for your cabins locker or they will be available for loan in the Camp Office.



How can I contact my camper in case of emergency?

The Malibu office in Egmont will be in contact with Malibu on a daily basis. (Contact between the mainland and Malibu is via satellite phone only. There are no direct phone lines in or out of Malibu, and there is no cell phone service in Malibu.) During office hours (8 am-4 pm PST, Monday thru Friday), you may call the Egmont office at (604) 883-2582. They will transmit your emergency message to your camper. During off hours, follow the directions on the Malibu answering machine at Egmont: (604) 883-2582. The Malibu fax at Egmont is (604) 883-2082.

Can students that do not attend Mars Hill attend?

Yes, everyone is welcome. We encourage students to bring their friends.

Will cabins be organized by grades or by churches?

We will mostly arrange cabins by church locations.

Will students need passports?

Everyone over 18 will need a passport. Students younger than 18 will be able to cross with a copy of their birth certificate and photo id. More information regarding travel documents are part of the registration process.

Who are the cabin leaders?

All cabin leaders will be Mars Hill Church members that have gone through the leader qualification process including a background check.

Where do campers need to be dropped off on departure day?

Departure location(s) will be communicated through email to those that have registered.

Who will the camp speaker be?

Tim Gaydos is the lead pastor of Mars Hill Church Downtown located in the heart of Seattle. Tim and his wife planted the church in 2008, with just a room full of people in their condo. Today, it is the largest and most prominent church in downtown Seattle with more than 1,300 in attendance across five services each weekend. Pastor Tim has been recognized as an influential leader in the city of Seattle, including being elected as President of the Belltown Business Association. In addition, Tim serves as Chaplain for the Seattle Sounders FC. Having been a Student Pastor at large churches over the years, Tim has brought his high-energy, passionate, engaging speaking style to conferences and camps throughout the country. Tim has been married to his wife Brittany for more than 7 years. They have two beautiful daughters, Eleanor Reese (2) and Leighton Grace (1), and they reside in downtown Seattle.

Who will be leading worship?

Citizens is a high energy indie rock band from Mars Hill U-District. Born in the heart of Seattle's university district, Citizens has quickly built a reputation for their dynamic hymn arrangements and high intensity anthems. Deacon Zach Bolen leads the band with a visible emotion and passion that stems from a desire to see everyone in the U-District worship Jesus as Lord.




